

Who should get a COVID-19 Booster Shot?

GET YOUR
SHOT

Booster Doses are to provide continued protection.

Additional Doses are for people who are moderately or severely immunocompromised.

PFIZER VACCINE

PEOPLE WHO **SHOULD** GET A BOOSTER SHOT:

- People **65 years and older** and **residents in long-term care settings**.
- People **aged 50-64 years** with **underlying medical conditions**.

THESE PEOPLE MAY ALSO RECEIVE A BOOSTER SHOT:

- People **aged 18-49 years** with **underlying medical conditions**, such as obesity and type 1 and 2 diabetes
- People **aged 18-64 years** who are **at increased risk** for COVID-19 exposure and transmission because of occupational or institutional setting, such as frontline medical workers, teachers, and first responders

Boosters should be given **at least six months after** an individual has received the **second of the two-dose vaccine**.
